

Hello Miss Atsuko.

I am very delighted about your email, thank you so much for reaching out. Our country has undergone to an enhanced community quarantine until April 30th. For the time being, mass gatherings are strictly prohibited as well. Classes and office works are temporarily suspended under further notice.

The number of the country's confirmed cases has reached to over 5,000 already with the death toll of more than 300. It is so saddening knowing that this pandemic has affected several lives.

Since that we are mandated to strictly stay at home, the very least that I can do for our community is to extend help to my neighbors who were in need. I have distributed relief goods for 25 families here in my barangay last week. The goods that I have distributed will only last for a week for each family. I hope the goods distributed by the government will also help those who are severely affected until the nationwide mandate is lifted.

As for our frontliners, problems keep on arising about the lack of protective gears that will help to protect themselves from the virus. Face masks and alcohols are always out of stock. Testing kits are procured already but I doubt if these will suffice. Chinese medical experts are already sent to the country and are doing the best that they can (at least, this information came from the news all over media).

I hope that you are doing OK miss Atsuko. Please extend my regards to Mr. Mori and Mr. Ishida.
